- Vouchers do not hold a seat. It is possible for a show to sell out before vouchers are redeemed. Please exchange your voucher as early as possible to avoid disappointment.
- If attending a specific performance has particular relevance to your programs or members, please let us know.
- Tours can be arranged for your group free of charge. If it is your first visit, consider booking a tour!
- Vouchers are distributed at the discretion of the Capitol Theatre and are subject to availability.
